Do you remember the Sony Walkman? I'd all but forgotten about it until I listened in to a radio programme last week in which it was held up as the single innovation that revolutionised our listening

habits. Many of you will recall that the Walkman was a portable cassette player which allowed people to listen to music while they were on the move.

I first encountered the Walkman in the summer of 1980. I was travelling on a tram in Vienna. The girl sitting opposite me removed a small box from her bag, opened it and inserted a cassette. She then

attached a pair of awkward looking headphones and quickly lost herself in a musical reverie. I was mesmerised and decided that I had to get one asap.

Within weeks I had my own personal Walkman and I spent hours recording tracks from vinyl LP's to cassette. The Walkman of course was only the beginning. Within the span of forty years we have lost

sight of the cassette entirely. The CD Discman player made sure of that. Once again, like many others, I went through my vinyl collection and began the process of 'burning' tracks so that I could listen to my favourite music while on the move. However it would appear that the cd is now on the way out. Ipods and mp3 players have taken over and the new technology has made it possible to access thousands of tracks at the press of a button.

As I grew up in the 1960's I was aware that my generation were fortunate. Technology had made it possible to watch living pictures in your living room via the television. The old wind - up record player

used by my grandparents had been replaced by the radiogram, the record player and the portable radio. Now that was progress! Little did I think that it was but a fraction of what was to come. Real

progress was on the horizon. Satellite television, the internet, and mobile phones would soon appear. A library of books on a kindle, a collection of music, built up over a number of years, on a device that

can fit into the palm of a hand, the ability to access movies and favourite television programmes in an instant. How fortunate we are. Things that we now take for granted and can't contemplate being

without are at our fingertips.

In recent months the hall has installed the necessary equipment to bring 'Window on the World' to Midmar. This will provide the opportunity to stream opera and ballet from stages across the world; to show important events such as the Wimbledon Final and the Last Night at the Proms on the big screen. All this has been made possible by the new technology. It's beyond me at times but I hope you will agree it is worth embracing. Look out for details of coming events.

The story of Jean and Bob Raeburn and their son Ginger who live in a top floor tenement flat in Aberdeen. It normally leaks like a sieve but it's the rainless, hot summer of 1976 and the place is as dry as a bone.

However, as the rent Officer is due to inspect for setting the rent, it might give the wrong impression of the worth of the flat.

Ma Raeburn thinks they should "introduce" some damp and that "tinkering" with the slates would do the job. So Bob and Ginger set about making some alterations to the roof. Ginger finds himself on the roof, dangling 100 feet over the ground, just like Richard Burton and Clint Eastwood in "Where Eagles Dare".

However, it's not the Germans who are the enemy here but the nesting seagulls. Meanwhile, Jean's brother Alex and his family turn up for an unexpected visit and can't quite understand what's going on and wonder where has Ginger got to?

Derek Laing's domestic comedy was the winner of the Charles Barron Prize for Doric Drama in 2013 and was first produced by Fleeman Productions in May 2014.

The 2019 production will be directed by Liz Loggie and will feature Fleeman regulars of Jill Innes, Brian McDonald and Yvonne Morton.

You probably think your stories are of no importance but everyone I've talked to has had great stories to tell and I'm sure yours will too and help fill a gap in my knowledge and bring it all together. Thank you!




